Much will depend upon your sense and sensibility. Our mission goals are to make Advances in Genomics and Genetics an important international, peer reviewed, open access journal that focuses on, exemplifying and explaining, new developments in characterizing the human and animal genome, the rapidly evolving research tools and techniques used in this arena, and applications of this study to health and disease. Emphasis will be given to those studies that discover and characterize genes, biomarkers, and targets in the development of new or improved therapeutic interventions, characterization of specific phenotypes and in understanding the full spectrum of a disease process. As such, we will publish reviews, original research, methodologies, technologies and analytics. Realizing the importance of keen observation, classification and clinical description as a first-step to any gene discovery/characterization in human disease, we will also publish case reports whose insight and timeliness may be seminal to the field.

Other journals share many of the same aims. What will distinguish Advances in Genomics and Genetics? Our goals, together, will be several-fold.
